OK, so you've seen the car, watched the video and been inspired to enter a pedal car race so *what next?* (For full details download getting on the grid see <http://pedalcarracing.info/wp-content/uploads/2015/01/Getting-on-the-Grid.pdf>)



First of all, you will need a team: If you want to join an existing team, the best thing to do is to go to www.pedalcarracing.info and ask on the online forum.

What makes a pedal car team?

Depending on the age group and which race you are allowed either 4, 5 or 6 drivers (unless you are solo or duo). In addition all

teams with youngsters racing will need to have a non-racing adult supervising in the pits and to fix problems, feed drivers and transport the car. Two or more adults is better.

What about a car? There are several ways to get yourself a racing pedal car.

Hire/rent? There are often cars available to rent. A good way to test the water.

Renovate a project car Often at season end old cars get sold on, they may need a full rebuild be only a rolling chassis or be fully ready to race.



Build your own Plans are available as is a kit along with suggested parts suppliers. Will need skill and effort but can be rewarding when you see your design racing.



What's it cost? For a single round entry from £45 per car + your travel/food costs

What's it like? Its hard work but also a lot of fun and very rewarding when you get that corner just right. We are a very friendly bunch (a lot are Scouters), teams help each other out, and you'll be pitted next to an experienced team who will freely offer advice.
